The course content includes basic trade skills in refinishing, sheet metal repair frame and unibody squaring and aligning, use of fillers, paint systems, and undercoats, related welding skills in related mechanical skills, trim-hardware maintenance, glass servicing, and other miscellaneous repairs, as well as cost estimation and customer service.

Tuition is \$2.92 per hour for Florida residents. Tuition is \$11.71 per hour for Non-Florida residents.
