Our mission is to produce highly skilled individuals and resourceful leaders through collaborative education to meet the ever-changing needs of our communities and the workforce.

History

Manatee Technical College (MTC) has been offering adult career and technical education since 1963. It was one of Florida's first tech centers. Manatee Vocational and Technical Center was built on 57th Avenue West and opened in August 1963 with 218 students in eight programs. MVTC was a pioneer. In 1965, the state designated the center an "area vocational school." Thus, the School Board changed its name to Manatee Area Vocational Technical Center. Over the next 12 years, MAVTC went through rapid expansion. With a renewed pioneering spirit and focus on excellence, the Board approved the third name change to Manatee Technical Institute (MTI) in 1997. During the ensuing years, MTI earned national recognition. In 2014, tech centers across the state began changing their names to technical colleges to better communicate that the credit offered is post-secondary and most students are adults. In December 2014, with input from students, staff and local business and industry, the Board approved the final name change to Manatee Technical College. In 2023-2024, MTC celebrated its sixtieth year of education excellence and its accomplishment as one of the longest running Public School Technical Colleges in the state of Florida.

Today

Manatee Technical College is one of 52 public tech centers/colleges in 32 school districts in Florida. MTC offers training for careers in 13 of the 15 in-demand industries requiring technical certification in Sarasota and Manatee counties. The Bradenton Area Economic Development Corporation, Manatee Chamber of Commerce, CareerSource Suncoast, Lakewood Ranch Business Alliance and many local companies count on MTC to help meet local workforce demands and attract new business and industry to the Bradenton area. Since the turn of the century, MTC has grown from one campus to two; MTC campuses span a total of 382,500 square feet. The original campus closed its doors when the new Main Campus on State Road 70 opened in 2013, the year of MTC's 50th Anniversary. Twenty years ago, the School Board built the East Campus in Lakewood Ranch to accommodate growth. This year MTC will open a new Law Enforcement Training Facility and start construction on a new Aviation Maintenance Technical Facility at the Sarasota Manatee Airport.
